### High Visibility Enforcement (HVE)

The Elizabeth Police Department participates in various initiatives in association with CDOT and the Colorado State Patrol. One of the initiatives is termed High Visibility Enforcement (HVE). The purpose of this initiative is conducting visible directed patrol focused on traffic infraction enforcement. The intent of this initiative is making the roads a safer place for the motoring public.

One of the most frequently received complaints, is speeding vehicles. The second most received complaint is the failure to obey traffic control signs. Both violations are contributing factors to traffic crashes. The High Visibility Enforcement initiative will focus effort on the mentioned violations along with other violations that are contributing factors to traffic crashes.

If you observe a heightened level of traffic enforcement in the Town of Elizabeth, it may be attributed to the HVE initiative. The Elizabeth Police Department is concerned for the safety of everyone who lives, works, recreates, and is just passing through.



## ROAD CLOSURES

**Saturday, September 23 - 8:00 am to 12:00 pm**

**MAIN STREET** will be closed from Broadway Street to Spruce Street (both lanes/both directions).

**SPRUCE STREET** will be closed from Main Street to Running Creek Trail.

**COUNTY ROAD 136** eastbound lane will be closed from High Point Trail to Elbert Street.

**ELBERT STREET/CR136** crossing point traffic will be directed by Elizabeth Police to avoid full closure and detour.

### Watering Restrictions

The Town of Elizabeth Public Works would like to remind everyone that the watering restriction program continues through the 30th of September.

Please note that many of the newer sprinkler systems have automated clocks with rain sensors that are capable of turning off your sprinklers or cycling your irrigation zones depending on the amount of rainfall that has been received. Please check your irrigation timing clocks to see if your clock has this capability and utilize it. If your clock does not have this feature, simply turning your clock or timer to off during rain or storms will have the same effect. Owner's manuals are typically easy to find on the internet and relatively easy to understand. If Public Works can be of help, please call or email the contact information below.
