The Town of Elizabeth is exploring the design for the *Main Street Streetscape* project. The design process will involve field work, coordination with Main Street residents and businesses, and the creation of engineering and design plans. Design options, cost estimates, and construction schedule and phasing will be explored as part of this process.

There are three public meetings scheduled throughout the design process. A kickoff/predesign meeting is scheduled for **Thursday, March 10th at 6:00 PM** at Town Hall. Our project team will be present to talk with you about what to expect as we begin the design. We encourage you to attend this meeting if your schedule allows. Warning Signs of Identity Theft

You may not know that you've experienced Identity theft immediately. You could be affected by ID theft if you receive:

- Bills for items you didn't buy
- Debt collection calls for accounts you didn't open
- Denials for loan application

Potential Victims of ID Theft

Anyone can experience identity theft. Children and seniors are both vulnerable to ID theft. Child ID theft may go undetected for many years. Victims may not know until they're adults, applying for their own loans.

Seniors often share their personal information with doctors and caregivers. The number of people and offices that access seniors' information put them at risk.
